

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# “Beat around the bush”

## Meaning

**Not telling the truth directly.**

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## Example:

**Stop beating around the bush. Just say what you want, Bob!**

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# “Out of Hand”

## Meaning

**Not under control, you can't control the situation**

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### Example:

**This rumor has really gotten out of hand.**

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# “Pull someone leg”

**Meaning**

**To joke with someone**


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**Example :**

**I didn't mean it, I'm just pulling your leg.**

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# “See eye to eye”

## Meaning

To agree with someone.

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### Example :

He and his uncle don't see eye to eye on politics.

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# “Speak of the devil”

## Meaning

The person who was just being discussed shows up.

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### Example :

Did you see Peter today? Oh,  
here he comes! Speak of the devil.

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# “Under the Weather”

**Meaning**

Feeling ill.

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**Example:**

Jame's under the weather and cannot come to work today.

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# “To bite your tongue”

## Meaning

You try not to say what you really feel or think.

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I was about to say something rude,  
but I bit my tongue.

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# “To spill the beans”

**Meaning**

**You are revealing a secret.**

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
**Example :**

**Come on Sam, spill the beans!  
What did Jane tell you yesterday?**

## Picture No. 9

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“To keep/leave someone in the dark”

### Meaning

You don't inform them about something.

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#### Example :

**It's better to let your girlfriend know things than to keep her in the dark.**

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“Once in a blue moon”

## Meaning

**Very seldom; almost never**

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### Example :

**I go to visit my grandfather only once in a blue moon, he lived in a remote farm house.**

Feeling ill




## **“SPEAK OF THE DEVIL”**

Very seldom : almost never




## **“TO BITE YOUR TONGUE”**
